**Sandtray Play Therapy: Level 10 – Capstone –
Integrating All Levels of Sandtray Therapy (24 CEs)**

In-Person

Description

The intention for this final workshop of the core curriculum is to create a culminating and integrating experience that will serve both as a completion of a skill set and an opening to a deeper level of practice. This training draws from all the previous levels of training and from the expertise of each practitioner to refine and integrate the basic knowledge and skills of sand tray clinical practice. Participants will explore clinical case material using the science of interpersonal neurobiology, the 20 powers of therapeutic play, the knowledge of symbolic language, and clinical experience. They also will have opportunities to demonstrate their clinical skills and to provide effective feedback to colleagues for the purpose of ongoing skill development.

Prerequisites: Levels 1-9; graduate degree in mental health or enrolled in a graduate degree program.

Educational Goals

This training will help participants to:

1. Identify, observe, and nurture sandtray play therapy skills in other professionals.
2. Describe the function of symbolic material in sandtray play therapy.
3. Discuss concepts of shame in the nervous system as it relates to sandtray play therapy.
4. Describe the function of mindfulness when facilitating sandtray play therapy.
5. Describe the polyvagal theory as it relates to sandtray play therapy.
6. Demonstrate competence in sandtray play therapy facilitation skills.
7. Describe ways to conceptualize a sandtray play therapy clinical case for consultation with a colleague or a supervisory consultant.
8. List risks associated with sandtray therapy.
9. List limitations of sandtray therapy with general populations.
10. List limitations of sandtray therapy with specific populations.
11. Discuss the meaning of liminal space in sandtray processing.
12. Describe the meaning of Kalff's "free and protected space" in sandtray play therapy.
13. Identify problematic issues associated with countertransference in sandtray play therapy.
14. Identify differences and similarities between the Lowenfeld and Kalff approaches to sandtray/sandplay therapy.

Theresa Kestly, PhD, RPT-S is a psychologist, educator, consultant, and a registered play therapist/supervisor with the Association for Play Therapy. She is an international presenter, and she maintains a private practice with specialties in play therapy and sandtray therapy in Corrales, New Mexico for children, adults, families, couples, and small groups. Theresa served as a senior staff psychologist at the Albuquerque Family and Child Guidance Center in Albuquerque, New Mexico where she specialized in child, adolescent and family therapy, consultations with the Indian Health Service, and consultations with the Albuquerque Public Schools. She supervised psychology, counseling, and psychiatry trainees as an adjunct faculty member at the University of New Mexico. Theresa served as the first president of the New Mexico Association for Play Therapy. She is the founder and director of the Sand Tray Training Institute of New Mexico in Corrales, New Mexico where she provides large-group seminars and small-group intensive training for psychotherapists in child and adult sandtray therapy. Theresa is author of *The Interpersonal Neurobiology of Play: Brain-Building Interventions for Emotional Well-Being* (Norton Interpersonal Neurobiology series).

Checking Your Personal CE Requirements

You need to attend the entire training sessions to receive credit. Partial credits cannot be given. In cases of family or other unavoidable emergencies that interrupt your attendance for a short time, makeup possibilities for time missed may incur a fee based on our hourly consultation rate.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Registration fees are refundable (less \$50.00 administrative fee & any credit card fees) if written notice is post-marked no later than 30 days before the training begins. As of September 2023, PayPal added processing fees for credit card refunds. Refunds require a minimum 6-week processing time. Registrants may transfer/sell their enrollment to another qualified person at any time. Transfer fee is \$50.00.

The Sand Tray Training Institute reserves the right to cancel a workshop due to insufficient enrollment, inclement weather, instructor illness, instructor family emergency, or some other unforeseen event. Notice will be provided as soon as possible via email with the option to reschedule for a future training date or to receive a full refund of paid workshop fees. Travel and lodging cannot be covered by our institution.

Makeup Policy

Certificates can be awarded only when the training is attended in full. In case of medical or family emergencies, makeup work may be arranged on an individual basis at an hourly consultation rate. The requirement for full attendance is a policy issued by the CE organizations that approve our trainings for continuing education credits.
