Sandtray Play Therapy: Level 2 – Symbolic Integration and Theory (In-Person)

Description

In this two-day workshop, participants discuss and work with symbolic meaning and basic theoretical ideas related to healing trauma and other clinical issues with sandtray therapy. The purpose of the didactic information in conjunction with hands-on experiences is to demonstrate why it is important to help clients experience the sandtray materials in a way that allows them to collaborate with their embodied brains, not just their cognitive processes. A focus for this training is on trauma as it is embedded throughout the body rather than in the cognitive layers of the brain only. In Level 2, participants continue to build on the concepts of “play as a neural exercise” for developing a nervous system that is flexible and resilient. There will be opportunities to explore core issues in play therapy. Participants also will have opportunities to practice skills using symbolic language with a workshop partner.

No Equipment Needed for Participation: Our in-person training does not have any equipment requirements. There are enough miniatures and sandtrays at our local site to support hands-on experiences for each person.

Educational Goals

This training will help participants to:

1. Identify skills for facilitating sandtray play therapy for trauma.
2. Describe culturally responsive sandtray play therapy techniques for clinical applications.



3. Compare universal and idiosyncratic symbolic material that emerges during sandtray play therapy.
4. Recite language that helps client experience their sandtray creations.
5. Describe the evolving meaning of symbolic material during sandtray play therapy (from unconscious to the conscious).
6. Identify the risks associated with interpretation in sandtray play therapy.
7. Describe the importance of Panksepp's play circuitry in the brain for developing a science-informed explanation for sandtray play therapy.
8. Demonstrate the facilitation of sandtray play therapy with peers.

Course Presenter: Aimee Jennings, LMHC

Aimee Jennings, LMHC is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor and a Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor with the Association for Play Therapy with over 30 years' experience in the field. She has a full-time private practice in Orlando Florida where she works with children, adolescents, adults and families as well as providing supervision for counselors working towards licensure. Aimee specializes in the use of play therapy, sand tray therapy and expressive arts within her practice. She has previously worked in community mental health, outpatient settings and school-based programs. In addition to her clinical practice, she has held numerous positions with the Florida Association for Play Therapy since 2018, and is currently the Chapter Chair for the Central Florida region.

Aimee began her sand tray journey in 2002 when Theresa Kestly began teaching workshops in Florida. Over the next ten years she completed her sand tray training and helped to develop the sand tray training program at the Institute of Playful Healing. Aimee has taught over 140 sand tray workshops through the Institute of Playful Healing from 2011 through 2023. She is happy to be joining the Sand Tray Training Institute of New Mexico to continue teaching sand tray workshops in Florida.

She supervised psychology, counseling, and psychiatry trainees as an adjunct faculty member at the University of New Mexico. Theresa served as the first president of the New Mexico Association for Play Therapy. She is the founder and director of the Sand Tray Training Institute of New Mexico in Corrales, New Mexico where she provides large-group seminars and small-group intensive training for psychotherapists in child and adult sandtray therapy.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Registration fees are refundable (less \$50.00 administrative fee & any credit card fees) if written notice is post-marked no later than 30 days before the training begins. As of September 2023, PayPal added processing fees for credit card refunds. Refunds require a minimum 6-week processing time. Registrants may transfer/sell their enrollment to another qualified person at any time. Transfer fee is \$50.00.
